What does an STNA do?

A Nursing Assistant, or a Nursing Aide, provides healthcare and support to patients in a medical facility. Their main duties include offering basic physical assistance to patients, feeding patients according to their dietary needs and recording vital signs.

Duties:

- Clean and bathe patients
- Help patients use the toilet and dress
- Turn, reposition, and transfer patients between beds and wheelchairs
- Listen to and record patients' health concerns and report that information to nurses
- Measure patients' vital signs, such as blood pressure and temperature
- Serve meals and help patients eat

What is their work environment like?

Most nursing assistants work in nursing and extended care facilities and in hospitals. They are physically active and may need to help lift or move patients.

How do you become an STNA?

STNAs typically enter the occupation with a certification from a Phlebotomy program. Almost all employers look for STNAs who have earned this professional certification.
